If you go to the Wildflower Church website, click on About Us, and then Rites of Passage, you will find there this statement about Child Dedications: “A Unitarian Universalist child dedication ceremony is a community recognition of and commitment to new life—most often infants and toddlers, newly adopted children, or young children whose families have recently joined the congregation. Generally held during regular church services, child dedications include vows of the parents and the larger family, a moment of naming in which the child is blessed with the presence of the chalice flame, a flower, and water, and finally a charge to the congregational community to be a loving, supporting presence for the child and the child's family.” Though this is one of the most moving kinds of ceremonies I have ever had the privilege to witness or lead, I have not yet had the opportunity to do so here at Wildflower Church. Before I arrived, Wildflower occasionally did these ceremonies for many children and families at one time. My personal preference is that one child, or one family at a time deserves to have the moment for themselves, so that we are really making our commitment to one child at a time. Many parents have spoken with me about having such a ceremony, but it’s not yet manifested. So! I would be so honored to have your child dedicated here as part of this just and beloved community, Wildflower Church.

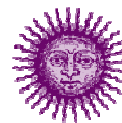
**Soul Collage® Group Meets Sunday, April 17.** Soul Collage® engages participants to use images to explore the inner landscape of their soul. This creative and intuit-

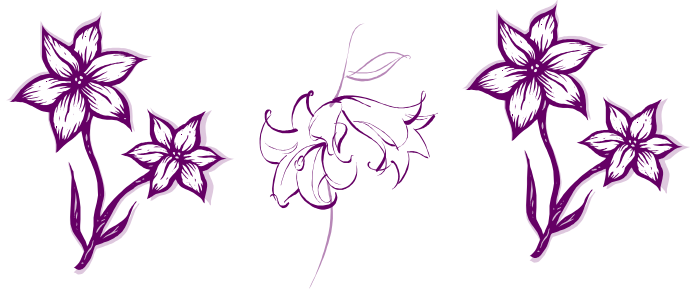
## ADULT PROGRAMMING: Adult Religious Education

## SHOULD WE PAUSE?

Following the receipt of the City's preliminary report a couple of weeks ago, our Building Committee, co-chaired by Paula Vaughan and Vicki Bradham, recommended that we not pursue the purchase of the land we have been considering. The Building Committee has presented a wealth of detailed information and reasoning to support their conclusion, and that information has been forwarded to our members. At its March 24 meeting, the Board adopted the Building Committee's recommendations to abandon our interest in this property. Now, the question is, What's next for us? Where do we go from here?

I have a suggestion. What about pausing for awhile from our search for a permanent physical location—take a breather—regroup and rest a bit? Our pursuit of this parcel of land has taken effort, most especially on the part of the Building Committee, but also on the part of the Board and on the part of the membership as well. It does, after all, take effort to read all those documents and emails, assimilate all that data, attend all those meetings, wrestle with all those decisions, and make all those changes on the calendar! And many of us are tired. A rest might not be a bad idea.

A pause would allow us to engage in more conversations about who we are, where we're going and what we want to be when we grow up! A pause could also enable us to put more energy into more immediate improvements to our communal life, such as developing our programs, having more social events, and considering the possibility of space-sharing with another congregation.

Speaking of space-sharing, our Space-Sharing Task Force, chaired by Jan Austin, has been hard at work exploring the possibilities of space-sharing with another congregation. Would space-sharing be a helpful interim solution while we're reassessing our long-term goals? Meeting in a larger space would give us room to grow. Having a place 24/7 would mean the end of hauling supplies back and forth and of searching for a place to have Easter and other holiday services. It would mean the re-birth of a real chalice flame, not having to rush through after-church meetings, and we could use all that recouped energy into building our future. Would those benefits be worth the necessary changes to our location and the time of our worship service? The Space-Sharing Task Force should be providing further information shortly. Stay tuned.

In the meantime, let's continue The Great Conversation. Let's meet after church for forums and potlucks. Let's have some fun because we have the best asset of all—we have each other!

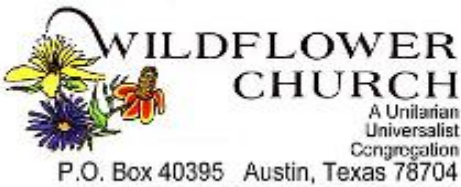
