Angelic Organics is now one of the country's largest CSA's. What makes the movie particularly fascinating is that John Peterson is a writer/poet/philosopher as well as being a farmer. This movie is really eye opening, entertaining and uplifting and has won numerous awards. It has been endorsed by Al Gore and Alice Waters! Flow, 2008	Irena Salina's award-winning documentary investigation into what experts label the most important political and environmental issue of the 21st Century - The World Water Crisis. Salina builds a case against the growing privatization of the world's dwindling fresh water supply with an unflinching focus on politics, pollution, human rights, and the emergence of a domineering world water cartel. Beyond identifying the problem, FLOW also gives viewers a look at the people and institutions providing practical solutions to the water crisis and those developing new technologies, which are fast becoming blueprints for a successful global and economic turnaround. For everyone with either a serious interest in these type of groups or just simple curiosity about an alternative to the mainstream, this DVD is highly recommended. One of today's biggest paradoxes is that half of the world's population lives in urban or suburban surroundings, yet many feel lonely and do not know their neighbors. This well-made documentary takes a look at several pioneering cohousing communities in Europe that have crafted a lifestyle that offers an antidote to this isolation. All the narration and interviews are in English. A variety of cohousing members of many different backgrounds and ages tell the engaging and inspiring stories of their lives in community.	59 min
